The Lee County Local Emergency Planning Committee met on December 16, 2015 at Lee County Emergency Services, 204 West Courtland Drive, Sanford, NC.

Chairman Roger Tankersley called the meeting to order at 11:48 a.m. and thanked David Vann/Coty for hosting lunch; individual introductions followed.

A motion was made by Kimberly Killian to accept the meeting minutes, as presented, from the September 16, 2015 meeting; seconded by Rich Draskinis; unanimous vote.

A motion was made by Kimberly Killian to approve the agenda for December 16, 2015, seconded by Gaynell Lee; unanimous vote.

No one was present to make public comments.

Kelley Richardson, Lee County Health Department, provided the quarterly SNS update with focus on a recently received "Bright Ideas" grant. (copy attached)

Shane advised that the 2015 Tier II Grant Award funds were used to purchase technology equipment consisting of HDTV's and zero client video IP boxes with licenses. These devices, placed strategically throughout the ES Office area and EOC will be used to monitor live weather station feeds and live weather events.

Shane briefly mentioned "Crisis Track", a damage assessment software that was recently used in a recovery exercise that Emergency Services participated in along with two neighboring counties and the state. With this easy to use mobile application, responders will be able to conduct damage assessment operations in as little as 10 minutes of field training. FEMA forms are auto-populated on the app, which is another key feature.

Emergency Services' Year in Review was presented by Shane with highlights of events throughout the year ranging from the 911/Dispatch Project, Search and Research, CBRNE threat, and many other events nestled in between, including weather and two exercises, Harris Nuclear Power Plant FEMA Graded Exercise and a Recovery Exercise.




