MEETING TIME/LOCATION: Quarterly in the months of January, April, July and October. Third Thursday, 10:00 a.m. in the COLTS facility located on Hilcrest Drive.

PURPOSE: Serve as a liaison between the residents of Lee County and the County Government concerning transportation issues and serve as lead agency in the operation of the County of Lee Transit System (COLTS).

NOTE: Operational By-Laws state that the Board be composed of (1) representative from each COLTS contractor purchasing a minimum of \$5,000 in transportation services annually, one member of the Lee County BOC, two at-large members appointed by the Commissioners, and representatives from the following organizations: Social Services, Aging Program, Health Dept., Mental Health, Vocational/Sheltered Workshop, Smart Start, Employment Security Commission,, One Stop Career Centers, Civic Groups, Private Citizens, Chamber of Commerce/Economic Development, Business/Industry, Emergency Medical Services, Private Transportation Providers, and Church Leaders.
